SCHOOL MENTORING PROGRAM

DISCUSSION

Mentoring and academic tutoring can go a long way toward keeping an at risk child in the school system and to help the child become successful. Children who participate in Alachua County's <u>Take Stock in</u> Children program sign a contract with the school to maintain good grades, to remain drug and crime free, and to meet weekly with an adult volunteer mentor. When the child completes the program, he/she receives a college tuition scholarship. For more information on the program go to http://www.acpsf.org/takestock.html.

Our neighborhood is zoned for Metcalfe Elementary School. We have 150 children who are being sent to other schools because Metcalfe is not an attractive school. Supporting Metcalfe and programs like Take Stock in Children is vital to our neighborhood.
